Biography Highlights

- Born Mar del Plata, Argentina.
- Resides, La Jolla, California.
- Married to Florencia and the father of four children, dividing his time between his hometown of Mar del Plata, Argentina and La Jolla, California.
- Speaks 3 languages (Spanish, English, and Portuguese);
- Law degree awarded by the Universidad Nacional de Mar del Plata, Argentina in 1984;
- 40 years of successful business leadership in the action sports industry around the world.
- Leader in the surfing movement. He led the charge for inclusion of surfing in the 2019 Pan Am Games and Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.
- President of the IOC recognized International Surfing Association (ISA) since 1994 and primary driver of the Federation's growth & development in last 24 years;
- The ISA also distributes scholarships between under 18 year old boys and girls around the world.
- Member "IOC Commission for Youth and Active Society", appointed by president Thomas Bach in 2015.
- Founder, Chairman & CEO of surf brand *Reef*, from 1984 to 2005 (sold it in 2005)
- Founder and 1st President of the Argentinean Surfing Association in 1978 despite a military dictatorial ban on the sport at the time. Got the ban lifted in 1979.
- Former co-founder and president of the SIMA Humanitarian Fund;
- Founder and 1st President of the Pan American Surfing Association. (1992-2002)
- First president of the environmental Surfrider Foundation in Argentina,
- Host and Chair of Liquid Nation Ball (2004/2011), for eight years hosting the largest surfing industry humanitarian fundraiser at his home in La Jolla, California.
- Served/serves on the global boards and contributed significant time income to charities such as SurfAid International, Save The Waves, SIMA Humanitarian Fund.
- Recipient of the "Dick Baker Memorial Award" in 2012.
- Recipient of the prestigious "Waterman of the Year Award" by SIMA in 2013, the highest surf industry recognition by his peers for his business, sporting and philanthropic leadership in Surfing and action sports;
- Recipient of the SIMA 2017 Special Recognition Award for the inclusion of Surfing in the Olympic Games
- Recipient of the 2017 California Surf Museum Silver Surfer Award.
- In 2018 inducted into the Huntington Beach Surfing Walk of Fame.
- Led the ISA into getting Surfing and SUP included into the 2019 Pan Am Games, in Lima, Peru (voted in July 2015).





- Led the ISA Olympic Surfing campaign for inclusion of surfing from 1994 until its inclusion in the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (voted in Aug/3/2016)
- A lifelong surfer, still finding the time to surf the waves of the world nearly every day, but especially those near his home in La Jolla, California, and at the venues of the ISA World Surfing Championships.
