

# Recognized Continental Surfing Associations



- Africa: African Surfing Confederation (ASC) now officially recognized. AGM held in April with 15 nations represented and Oumar Seye (SEN) elected as president of ASC.
- Asia: Asian Surfing Federation (ASF) hosted Asian Surfing Championships in the Maldives in July along with AGM ASF with representatives from 11 member nations and 5 non-member National Federations.
- Oceania: The Oceania Surfing Federation (OSF) hosted development program in Fiji in November 2023.
- Europe: European Surfing Federation hosted annual Euro Surf events.
- Americas: Pan American Surf Association hosted the PASA Games in Panama in April and supported Pan American Games in Santiago in October.

## **Olympic Solidarity**






- Olympic Solidarity offers funding to support the following areas: athletes, coaches, administrators, promotion of the Olympic values, knowledge-sharing and participation in the Games





#### Drowning Prevention Research:

- Bystander Rescue Survey sent to past ISA/ILS Course Participants and ISA Coaches
- Findings: 938 total bystander (off-duty)
   rescues performed by 169 respondents
- Conclusion: Lifesaving ability is enhanced by surfing experience, previous number of rescues, and rescue/first aid training
- Data presented at the World Conference on Drowning Prevention

### ISA/ILS Water Safety Course:

- 2023 to-date: over 830 coaches participating in ISA/ILS Water Safety Course
- Over 75 courses in 24 countries

#### ISA JUDGING CERTIFICATION PATHWAY



- April 2023, we officially launched restructured of Judging and Officiating Program:
- E-learning course is now a prerequisite for judging certification. Course available in English, Spanish, and Portuguese.
- 5 Levels of Judging Level 4 is for judges with 400+ hours and NF recommendation, Level 5 is for elite judges actively judging ISA World Championships and WSL Championship Tour
- ISA hosting International Judging Courses
- Simpler to license and run ISA Judging Program on a national level. Offering NF Launch Package and other bulk licensing discounts through the first half of 2024


2023 Judging Program Highlights and Stats:

- Large increase in quality and quantity for ISA
   Judging Program with 883 program participants
   and 750+ e-learning courses
- ISA Hosted International Courses (August 2023:
  - English Course 55 Participants, 26 Countries ,5 continents
  - Spanish Course: 22 Participants, 13 Countries, 3 continents
- Tahitian Judging Course collaboration with Federation Tahitienne de Surf to deliver course in French and train 39 Tahitian judges
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Sao Paulo Surf Forum:
  - 2-day Portuguese Judging course for 79 participants
  - Collaboration with Sao Paulo Govt.
  - Judges from Portuguese speaking African nations (ANG, CPV, MOZ, STP) participated virtually

## ISA Development Update – Para Surfing

- Record participating at 2023 ISA WPSC in Huntington Beach - 184 athletes from 27 National Teams. Amazing surf conditions, performances, and content from this event.
- Para Surfing in the final stages of review for inclusion as an additional sport for the Los Angeles 2028 Paralympic Games. Representatives from LA2028 attended 2023 WPSC. Decision in early 2024.
- ISA Head of Para Surfing Classification Dr.
   Maureen Johnson attended IPC Classification
   Meeting in October 2023 where Para
   Surfing's classification system received
   positive feedback from the IPC. Over 450
   athletes officially classified in Para Surfing
